From the Principal School Satisfaction Survey

School satisfaction surveys for students, parents and staff are currently being conducted. Recognising student achievement

I am very pleased to report that our NAPLAN results have improved as compared to previous years and our focus has been on improving outcomes for students below the benchmark. The results in Writing were particularly impressive. Jill Alexander (and previously Erika Boas) has been working alongside teachers in the role of Assistant Principal Raising the Bar and Nathan Duhig is working with us in Numeracy Support, particularly working with Gr 8 students in numeracy. This extra support provides for further development of both teacher and student understandings and will lead to further improvements in student outcomes.

In this Newsletter and on our Facebook page, you will see and read about the amazing achievements of our students. The opportunities provided at Ogilvie are across a broad range of areas and I am very proud of the commitment made by students and the dedication they have to achieving their best. I also wish to acknowledge and thank the staff at Ogilvie who give so willingly of their time to nurture the talents of students through these very enriching learning experiences. Take some time to thank our teachers when you get the opportunity. Recent major achievements have been Olivia Ware's winning entry in the Year 9-10 Young Archies competition, the performances of our band (combined with NTHS) and our three winning teams from Tournament of Minds – who head off to the Gold Coast in

October to compete at the National finals. Another example of teachers providing for the development of relationships between New Town High School and Ogilvie is the Gr 10 Social to be held at City Hall this Thursday evening.

As I write this, about a quarter of our girls are preparing for the House Dance performance at Aurora Stadium. This is a fantastic opportunity for girls to mix across the grades and for our senior girls to show leadership and mentor younger girls. We'll report on this on our Facebook page.

We were very pleased to host Year 6 students and families for their Transition to High School evening on 23 August. I am sure that all present learned so much about Ogilvie and are now looking forward with anticipation to the start of the new School year in 2017. I highly recommend watching the video on our Facebook page that the eTeam girls produced especially for this occasion, that highlights what our girls love about being in an all-girls school and the opportunities this affords them.

Gr 10s have participated in a number of Taste of TAFE courses and they continue to plan for their future through their involvement in My Education. Recently Gr 10s were able to complete their preliminary enrolments for Elizabeth College, with staff from the college coming to Ogilvie to counsel girls about their subject choices. We also have an evening session at Ogilvie next week where Elizabeth College staff will be working with our Senior School teachers to improve their knowledge and understanding of Year 11/12 courses and the requirements of the TCE and ATAR. These opportunities are setting our girls up for success as they further their pathway planning.
